

January 8, 1959

A special meeting was called to order by Mayor Mumper, all Councilmen present except Mr. Bureh.

Mayor Mumper read the agreement for the Short Line, Water Line Extension. The agreement was acceptable to all members present. Mr. Coss asked Council to change the working in the contract from work days to read workable days. This was agreeable to Council.

Mr. Roeder made a motion seconded Mr. Crouser the village pay Mr. Coss 15% of the total contract price of \$6798.00 or \$1,019.70 upon commencement of the installation of the water line. Voted and passed unanimously.

Mr Coss and Council ^{agreed} to the following: Council will pay 60% of the contract price upon completion of the job and the balance on approval of the Village Water Board and Department of Health of the State of West Virginia. Mr. Coss is to turn in all bills to the Village and checks are to be made out in the name of Joe Coss and the name of supplier of materials.

A Motion was made by Mr. Roeder and seconded by Mr. Palmer that Council ask Fire Chief Bash and a committee from Kircher Heights to meet and establish where the four (4) fire plugs will be installed. Voted and passed unanimously.

Motion for adjournment made by Mr. Roeder seconded by Mr. Bible. Voted and passed unanimously.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Mumper at Seven O'clock. Two members absent. Minutes of the last three meetings read and approved.

Mr. Roeder reported a price of \$2.50 for slag from James Peel. Mayor Mumper reported Mr. Ed. Simon of Whg. Steel Corp. said the Village could get Iron slag from Wheeling Steel Corp. for the cost of loading a truck. (About .75 A load).

RECREATION HALL

Mr. Bible cleaned and repaired the gas hot plate.

Mr. Roeder made a motion seconded by Mr. Bible the rent for the recreation hall be increased to \$2.00 per night. Voted and passed.

FIRE PLUGS AND T's ON WATER LINE SOUTH OF BEECH BOTTOM.

Fire Chief Bash and his 3 Captains suggested the Village install 5 T's and 3 Fire plugs on the water line to be installed south of Beech Bottom. All fire plugs to be within 500 feet of all houses now standing.

Mr. Crouser made a motion that Mayor Mumper be given the authority to see if Mr. Coss would install complete three fire plugs and five Ts at a cost of \$575.00. Seconded by Mr. Roeder. Voted and passed unanimously.

Committee Reports

Streets -- Mr. Roeder reported that Tri-State Asphalt is thru patching work for the winter.

Garbage - Mr. Roeder made a motion seconded by Mr. Bible the Recorder send a letter to the Garbage Collector, Mr. DeEgedio, concerning the unsatisfactory garbage collections. Voted and passed unan.

Light and Power - The recorder was asked to notify the Monongahela West Penn Public Service System that light is out on corner of Valley Camp Store.

The Fire Department has ordered a new 1000 Gallon Tanker, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " hose, Portable Tank G M C make with the largest engine possible, rigged for future front mount pump. Purchased from Supton of Columbus, Ohio.

Mr. Bible made a motion seconded by Mr. Roeder the present Fire House be altered as needed to make room for the new truck at the expense of the Fire Department. Voted and passed unanimously.

OLD TRUCK

Mr. Roeder made a motion seconded by Mr. Crouser the old fire truck be stripped of all usable materials and junk the truck and any profits from the sale be put in the Village Treasury. Voted and passed unanimously.

Mr. Roeder made motion for adjournment seconded by Mr. Bible.

OLD BUSINESS

Mr. Palmer made motion, seconded by Mr. Bible that the Village give Mr. Lee Denbow permission to use Village truck and get red dog to fill holes in front of Council and doctor's office, and also that one other person be hired to help load and unload truck. Passed unanimously.

Mr. Roeder, Mr. Palmer and Mr. Crouser to contact Mr. Pryor about the legality of raising garbage bill One Dollar per month for the repair of streets.

Mr. Coss stated it would take approximately \$700.00 for materials and installation of three fire plugs and five tees on water line South of Village. Mr. Coss to check further and prepare a breakdown of the costs.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Recreation Committee will meet with representatives of the youth group 6:30 P.M. Feb. 15, 1959 to discuss the possibilities of securing the school gym for recreational purposes and to discuss use of city recreation hall one night a week for dances. Old recreation board will be contacted by the committee to determine if any money is left in treasury for supplies. Committee will also contact Mr. Adams and Mr. Smith concerning the use of the school gym.

Traffic Committee will contact Mr. Pryor about Ordinance for parking in the Village. Parking in alleys was discussed as to the advisability of putting up NO PARKING signs.

MAYORS REPORT

Mr. Mumper stated that the Volunteer Fire Department had made a name for themselves at the Kopper Co. and Cross Creek Fires, and that they should be commended for their actions. The work of the Fire Dept. has brought favorable publicity to the Village.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

STREETS Mr. Roeder reported the storm sewers and streets have been cleaned. Mr. Roeder made a motion seconded by Mr. Palmer a roster be made of people available for work in the Village be made. Any persons interested in working contact Mr. Roeder. Voted and Passed unanimously.

RECREATION Mr. Bible reported arrangements have been made with Mr. Adams for the boys to use the school gym each Wednesday night. The girls may have one night a week if they are interested in using the facilities. Mr. Adams made a list of rules for use of the gym.

Dances are to be held for the youth every Thursday night in the Village Hall. Proceeds from previous dances \$41.00

Mr. Bible presented a bill for two basketballs \$21.52. Mr. Palmer made a motion seconded by Mr. Roeder this bill be paid. Voted and passed unanimously.

GARBAGE Mr. Bible reported complaints are still being made on door pickup. Four deliquente avounts have been turned over to the squire for collection.

STREETLIGHTS Mr. Palmer reported the Monongahelia West Penn Power Co. have checked all street lights.

TRAFFIC Mr. Brouser reported Mr. Pryor asked for information necessary to write an Ordinance for restrieted parking the Village.

MAYORS REPORT. Mr. Mumper reported the first town meeting a success, committees formed and officers elected. This group is to operate independantly of the Vilhge Council. One suggestion made at the meeting was an ordinance be written requiring residents to clean snow and ice from the sidewalks. Mr. Roeder made a motion this ordinance be drawn up, seconded by Mrs. Mumper. Voted and passed.

SEWERAGE PLANT. Letter received and read from the State Water Commission asking what progress the village has made in starting a Sewerage Disposal Plant. Mr. Pryor answered the letter explaining the financial status of the Village.

OLD FIRE TRUCK Mr. Palmer made a motion seconded by Mr. Crouser appointing Paul Custer Jr. and Charles Roeder to be a committee of two to dispose of the old fire truck. Voted and passed unanimously

Constable Neven asked what is the village's authority on inspection tickets. Mayor Mumper will see Mr. Pryor and report at next meeting.

Ray Myers is to see if the Sheriff has any posts so speed signs can be erected. Mr. Wiley Mumper and Mrs. Walter Campbell, trustees for the Beech Bottom Improvement association attended the meeting and reported they are planning a joint meeting with the Youth Committee, and that Windsor Heights hauls their own garbage and they suggest Beech Bottom do the same. Mayor Mumper will check insurance policies to see who is covered to drive village truck and find out if it is necessary a contract be drawn up if the Village does its own garbage hauling.

WATER LINE SOUTH OF B. B. The Wheeling Steel Corporation said they would send right-of-way just as soon as it is completed.

STREETS Mr. Roeder is to check and report at the next meeting on a price from Tri-State Asphalt on the topping of all streets in the Village and Mr. Nevin to get a price from Tony Manzo of Wheeling. Any one knowing of any other concern doing this work is to contact and report at next meeting.

Mr. Roeder made a motion seconded by Mr. Crouser an ordinance be drawn up for a load limit on High Street between Third Street and Stop 48. Voted and passed unanimously.

GARBAGE Mr. Roeder made a motion seconded by Mr. Bible to dispense with the three reading on a new ordinance. Voted and passed unanimously. Mr. Roeder made a motion seconded by Mrs. Mumper to amend section 5, Item 1 of the Garbage Ordinance to read as follows: On and after the first day of April 1959 the rates for collection of garbage and service to the people of Beech Bottom shall be: A single family residence including garage apartments \$2.25 per month; each apartment \$2.25 per month. Voted and passed unanimously.

Motion for adjournment made by Mr. Roeder seconded by Mr. Crouser. Voted and passed unanimously.

Mayor Mumper called the meeting to order all members present. Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

The Resignation of Ray Myers as Deputy Constable was read. Mr. Burch made a motion the resignation be accepted with regrets. Seconded by Mr. Crouser. Voted and passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS

Mayor Mumper reported the City has the authority to arrest for expired inspection tickets on automobiles and that the Water line South of Beech Bottom has been approved.

STREETS

Mr. Roeder reported he had contacted Tri-State Asphalt Co. Mr. Trigg their representative attended the meeting and reported the following: There is approximately 13,387 square yards of work and cleaning the streets in preparation for the job would be \$300.00 this work could be done by local labor. Tack coat \$800.00. Paving with 2 inch average \$17,526.97 this would be on a cash basis and the prices are not a firm bid. Tri-State rents tar machine so we could do our own patch work and to do this job satisfactory the holes should be cut square and straight down. The Tri-State Asphalt Co. requires a notice of 30 days before starting work. Mr. Trigg recommended a load limit be placed on the streets. Approximate cost of patching six or seven hundred dollars. 14,000 Tons of material needed to cover all streets with a 2 inch average.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Recreation - Mr. Burch no report

Garbage - Mr. Bible no report.

Mr. Mumper reported Mr. DiEgidio has called his and asked for a 10% increase in his rates. Mr. Roeder made a motion seconded by Mr. Burch the present rate of paying Mr. Di Egidio be continued. Voted and passed unan.

STREET LIGHTS Mr. Palmer reported all lights are working.

STREETS Mr. Crouser read the proposed one side parking on High Street as follows:
First Street to second Street no parking on the West side.
Second Street to Third Street no parking on the East Side.

The Recorder was asked to write to John W. Patterson Co. Pittsburgh and to the State Road Commission of West Virginia and ask for a list of used equipment they might have for sale.

DEPUTY MASHALL

Mr. Roeder made a motion seconded by Mr. Palmer that Paul Custer Jr. be appointed deputy mashall. Voted and passed unanimously.

Mr. Hadden has asked permission to extend the sewer from the Southern end of lot 235 to the existing sewer line in Hill Street. All work to be done at his expense and the street to be replaced in as good a condition as is at present. Mr. Roeder made a motion we grant Mr. Hadden this right seconded by Mr. Palmer. Voted and passed unanimously.

Mr. Roeder asked why water tank covers have not been replaced on water towers. This is a dangerous condition and should be taken care off.

Mr. Paul Custer Jr. reported he has sold pumps, water tanks and rear axel from the old fire truck and turned in to the city treasury \$57.00.

Mr. Roeder suggested the City have an ordinance for Building Permit drawn up. The Recorder to contact Mr. Pryor.

WATER LINE

Mayor Mumper read a breakdown of cost to install hydrants and tees on water line south of Beech Bottom. Motion was made by Mr. Roeder seconded by Mr. Burch the Village of Beech Bottom contribute approximately \$117.00 for 3 fire plugs and 3 "Ts". This money to be paid by the Water Board for the Water Line South of Beech Bottom. Voted and passed unanimously.

Mayor Mumper asked permission to enter into a written agreement with the Whg. Steel Corp. for a right-of-way for Water Line Extension South of Beech Bottom. Permission granted.

Recorder Mumper made a motion seconded by Mr. Roeder the village buy two new Traffic Baton flash lights. Voted and passed unanimously.

#12 STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING ORDINANCE FOR THE VILLAGE OF BEECH BOTTOM

(A) No person shall stop or park or leave standing any vehicle whether attended or unattended upon the paved or main traveled part of the east side of High Street in the Village of Beech Bottom between Second and Third Street, or on the west side of High Street in the Village of Beech Bottom between First and Second Street

No person shall stop, park or leave standing any vehicle upon the paved or main traveled part of the south side of Third Street in the Village of Beech Bottom.

(B) This section shall not apply to the driver of any vehicle which is disabled while on the paved or main traveled portion of the highway to such manner and to such extent that it is impossible to avoid stopping and temporarily leaving such disabled vehicle in such position.

(C) When ever any police officer finds a vehicle standing upon the aforesaid streets in violation of the aforesaid provision, such officer is hereby authorized to move such vehicle or require

the driver or other person in charge of such vehicle to move the same, or to provide for the removal of such vehicle to the nearest garage at the expense of the owner of such vehicle.

(D) It shall be unlawful for any truck, bus or motor vehicle, with the exception of school busses weighing in excess of three ton or which has a gross weight when loaded in excess of three ton to travel on High Street between Third Street and Stop 48 in the Village of Beech Bottom.

(E) It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance, and every person convicted of such demeanor or such violation shall be punished by a fine of not less than Three Dollars (\$3.00) nor more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00), and if such fine is not paid, then the person being convicted of such violation may be confined to the Brooke County Jail for a period of ten days or until said fine and cost have been paid.

Mr. William Craven of the Pine Motel asked Council to consider the sale of the alley bordering on his property lots # 138 thru 145.

Mr. Crouser made a motion seconded by Mr. Burch equipment be ordered for the marshall (gun, holster, cartrage case, belt and badge be repaired)
Voted and passed unanimously.

LEVY ORDER AND ESTIMATE.

Council order the tap to be taken out at the Cazin property.

Mr. Tony Mazella appeared before Council and asked if the City Council would be willing to sell water to the houses North of Beech Bottom. Council agreed that unless something unforeseen happens Beech Bottom would agree to sell water to the people.

Motion for adjournment was made by Mrs. Mumper seconded by Mr. Crouser. Voted and passed unanimously.

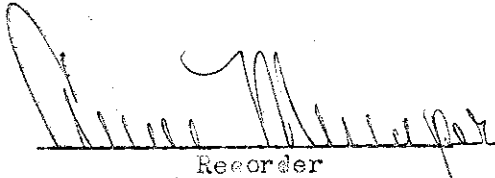

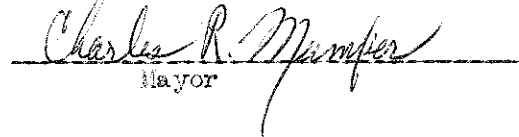

Mayor Charles Mumper called the meeting to order at Seven O'clock. Minutes of the three previous meetings were read and approved. There Was no regular meeting of council during the month of August due to the fact a quarrem could not be raised. Too many members on vacation and picket duty due to the steel strike.

Sale of Alley back of Pine Motel

Mr. Crouser made a motion seconded by Mr. Roeder that Mr. Craven and Mr. Walter Campbell appear at the next meeting of council and be prepared to make an offer for the portion of the alley abutting their property. Voted and passed unanimously. Mayor Mumper appointed Mr. Crouser a committee of one to see Mr. Craven and Mr. Campbell.

The Recorder was asked to write a letter to the P T A and see if they would start a School Boy Patrol. The recorder was also asked to call Mr. Pryor to find out what he had done about writting a letter to the Brooke County Board of Education asking the board to install a sidewalk infront of the school.

Mr. Crouser made a motion to waiver the third reading of the Ordinance for Stopping, Standing and Parking in Beech Bottom. Mr. Roeder seconded the motion. Voted and passed.

WATER LINE SOUTH OF BEECH BOTTOM.

7. Tap at Cazin's has never been taken out.
8. #3 Fire plug does not drain fast enough.
9. Check dead end at #45.
Tile filled with dirt, tile is resting one line, Not enough room to make connection on blow off line. Should be at least $1\frac{1}{2}$ or 2" blow off line.
10. Check on main line being encased in concrete in two different places.

Mr. Coss said he would lookin to the complaints.

Mr. Charles Roeder made a motion seconded by Mr. Crouser that the tap at Mr. Cazin's property be covered with cement. Voted and passed.
